### It's Like Riding a Bike

### Be strong and courageous. Do not fear or be in dread of them, for it is the LORD your God who goes with you. He will not leave you or forsake you." (Deut. 31:6)

Moses instructs the Israelites that God will fulfill his promise to make of them a great nation and God will lead his people into the Promised Land. They have been wandering in the wilderness for 40 years trying to avoid overwhelming nations. Stuck in their wandering, they have struggled with going forward with a new vision.

"It's like riding a bike". This is a phrase that speaks to the comfort level we have in doing things the way we always have done them. Trying something new or a different way of doing something is hard and not something we feel comfortable doing.

Destin Sandlin, an engineer, was challenged by his coworkers to try riding a bike that they built with an opposite steering mechanism. When you turn the handle bars to the right the wheel goes to the left and vice versa. He figured he could master the change rather easily. But it took him 8 months of practice in his driveway along with quite a few spills before he mastered riding this bike.

This is the challenge we are faced with in lower church attendance nationwide. Changing how we do church differently to attract people is a challenge. Just like with the backward bike, old habits are hard to change and so too are doing things differently.

First, we can practice doing faith in our "driveways". We can share faith stories one on one with each other. Share a story of a time when you felt most spiritually alive, energized, and engaged.

Second, we can seek ways in which we can tell our faith stories and listen to others faith stories in our communities and in the activities in which we participate.

I found a good idea on line about how as a group we could ask to set up a table at a laundromat and offer to pay for cleaning their clothes and pray with or for them. Then return several times for a month or two.

Most of us are busy attending activities in which our children/grandchildren are participating. We can strike up conversations about how God has gotten us through some tough times.

Riding a backward bike and engaging people in faith stories is hard but can be done with practice. May you know the presence of Jesus as he rides beside you on your faith journey?




# Daycare Update

Through this program, an individual moves from Supported Community Living into a private family home with a carefully selected Host Homes Provider who provides 24/7 support for the client.

"Working directly with my clients to help them complete goals and work around obstacles is my favorite part of my job," said Erica Hill Murray, a Host Homes Provider at LSI. "I enjoy showing them that there are people in their lives who care about them, are proud of them, and proud to help them."

Erica has helped many clients in the five years she has provided care at LSI, but one client, in particular, has made great strides under her care.

"I worked with a client who wanted to find a job or volunteer position, but she had two obstacles in her way: she had trouble using a computer, and she wasn't confident in her ability to speak in an interview," said Erica. "I offered to look for positions on the computer with her and to call potential employers to explain what she was looking for. After working with her, we found her a volunteer position for a couple of days a week, and she was delighted."

"She thanked me for helping her and said that she was happy that, for once, someone understood her drive to want to work," said Erica. "I like to make a difference – even if it is small. Helping others, no matter at what level, is impactful. I love working at LSI, and I believe my position as a Host Homes Provider has been my favorite position in life."

- Scripture: "Then [Jesus] opened [the disciples'] minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And see, I am sending upon you what my Father promised; so stay here in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high" (Luke 24:44-49).
- 2. **Prayer from Bread for the Day:** "Almighty God, your blessed Son, our Savior Jesus Christ, ascended far above all heavens that he might fill all things. Mercifully give us faith to trust that, as he promised, he abides with us on earth to the end of time, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever."
- 3. Journal prompt: In your own words, define "repentance" and "forgiveness."
- 4. Hymn: "A Hymn of Glory Let Us Sing!" (ELW, 393).
- 5. Contemplative question: Spend 5-10 minutes in silence, contemplating the Scripture for today. Meditate on these questions: How might you need to forgive someone in your life? How might you need to forgive yourself?
