

DAYCARE

Daycare renovations are moving forward day by day! We are seeing a lot of progress in getting the building ready. I have learned not to walk through often so that when I do wander through, I can see the progress happening! Day by day new HVAC is installed, and heat and electrical components are being installed.

The new hood vent for the upstairs kitchen has finally arrived and the electric crew will be working on getting that installed. Once the big hood and a heater are installed in the kitchen, we can get to work getting the kitchen renovation started. We have put a lot of thought into the kitchen area to make it more user-friendly. A new handwashing sink will be going in, a three-compartment sink as well as a deeper farmhouse -style sink that will allow for roaster pans and bigger pots to be washed more easily. There will be two island areas to allow for better functionality within the kitchen. We plan to utilize the dishwasher that was previously in the kitchen as well as add an under-counter dishwasher for smaller loads.

The back door area near the kitchen is getting prepped for a new handicap-accessible ramp and sidewalk extending out to where the fence will be for the playground.

The playground equipment has arrived, and the company did a great job of putting the structures together. I was so impressed to watch the progress of the equipment installation. The pour-in-place surfacing is installed and looks great!! Our shade structures will be getting installed over the next few weeks as well as the fencing.

Construction is anticipated to be completed at the end of December. Please pray construction continues to remain on track and that we continue to have forward motion! We are planning on taking January to set up rooms, hire employees, and prepare for opening.

I am anticipating opening our official waitlist sometime in November. We will send out an announcement as well as post on our daycare Facebook page Kingdom Kids of St. Olaf. I am excited to think in just a few

and homes to children and teens. This month at LSI, we celebrate the families we support through Foster Care and Adoption and raise awareness for the hundreds of lowa children needing a safe, healthy home.

lowa foster families, like the Smiths*, raise the bar by opening their loving households to children and teens in need of a place to call home.

At LSI, we understand the importance of keeping youth in their communities to help maintain connections and stability during times of transition. So, when our staff received a referral for a teenage girl needing foster care placement, they looked inward toward the community.

At the time, homes in the area were either full or not open to accepting teenage placements. Coincidentally, the Smiths were present at a meeting the same night the referral came in. When they heard about Rebecca's* situation, they immediately knew who the child was and wanted to help in any way they could.

The Smiths were already over their licensing capacity, having been granted a variance to accept a sibling group. To be able to bring Rebecca into their home, they would need to be given another variance, which was almost unheard of.

"It was by chance, or the grace of God, that the Smiths were able to accept another child, and give Rebecca a stable placement with a family in her community," said Dawn Luetje, LSI Director of Resource Family Licensing and Support, working in conjunction with Four Oaks Family Connections.

Thanks to the combined support of the Smiths, LSI staff, and the community, Rebecca was placed in the foster home, where she could maintain her daily activities with the teachers, coaches, and friends she was comfortable with. Rebecca continues to thrive in a stable, loving foster home environment and a caring community.
