

Note From The Pastor



Waiting in the Dark

Wait for the Lord, be strong and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord! (Psalm 27:14)

Two summers ago, Mindy and I went to Alaska and Canada and thoroughly enjoyed the experience of nature/God's country and all of its pristine beauty. It's a unique experience to be in a place and time where it is always light out. On the flip side, in the winter it is pretty much dark all the time. I asked a native of the Canadian wilderness, "How do you manage living in the darkness for several months out of the year?" Her answer was that she keeps busy with chores and all of the things necessary to survive in the wilderness and looks forward to when the light will return.

I do not like waiting! Waiting for the stop light to turn green, the slow moving car in front of me, long checkout lines, waiting rooms, a package to arrive, back pain to go away . . .!!!

So what do you do during times of waiting? Scream, cry, read a book, check out social media on your phone, binge watch TV shows on Netflix . . . ?

At a First Call Pastors meeting the Western Iowa Synod Mental Counselor guided us through a, "Mindfulness" exercise that helps you in times of stress. It involves several deep breaths in and out as you focus on the presence. What is causing you stress, physically and mentally? Gradually give that stress to God as you trust in his presence.

Jesus knows your pain better than anyone because he died an excruciating, humiliating

death on a cross for you. Lift up prayers to Jesus. Read daily Advent devotions or watch them on social media. Pray for those you love and those you wish would stay out of your way. Give thanks to the creator of the universe who shines his light in the dark.

May you be filled with hope, joy, and peace as you wait for Jesus in the dark.

On November 1 & 5 we lit candles for those who were baptized and to remember our saints who have gone before us.






CONFIRMATION RETREAT








POINTSETTIA ORDERS

In the spirit of giving, the spirit of love, and the spirit of working together, let us stand with them and lift them up this Christmas season.




